Congress Scheduled for September 11-15 in Montréal

Montréal, Dec. 13 – On the fifth anniversary of the attacks of 9/11, representatives from the world's religions will meet in Montréal, Canada for a unique purpose. The global congress, World's Religions After September 11, aims to replace “the clash of civilizations” with an interfaith conversation of respect and understanding.
